Symptoms of anaphylaxis may include those of a mild allergic reaction as well as: severe shortness of breath due to closure of your airways severely low blood pressure very fast or slow heart rate or abnormal heart rhythm (arrhythmia) dizziness shock respiratory failure cardiac arrest

Anesthesia Allergy: Symptoms, Allergies vs. Side Effects ...

Anaphylaxis is a severe allergic reaction that occurs very rapidly, with massive release of chemical substances by the body. During the reaction these chemicals can result in breathing difficulty, wheezing, low blood pressure, swelling, and skin problems including urticaria (hives) and red rashes.

Serious allergy during an anaesthetic (anaphylaxis)

Clinicians have long worried whether such patients are more likely to have an anaphylactic or anaphylactoid reaction during anesthesia. Such a correlation holds true for latex allergy. A history of generalized atopy or specific allergy to certain fruits (e.g. , kiwi, avocado, figs) are both recognized as significant risk factors for latex reactions. However, other than for latex, a generalized history of allergy seems to be of little consequence in predisposing to anaphylactic and ...

Anaphylaxis is a life-threatening immediate hypersensitivity reaction which presents as upper airway obstruction, dyspnoea, syncope and/or hypotension. This complex of physiological changes involving the cardiovascular, respiratory and cutaneous systems is caused by an allergic reaction.

Reactions occur in two groups, those with significant previous exposure and those with an atopic predisposition. The prevalence of sensitization is 10% among healthcare workers and 15% in anaesthetic staff, 9 but not all these individuals exhibit clinical allergy. Children undergoing repeated operations with high latex exposure or repeated bladder catheterization (e.g. spina bifida) have a 40-50% risk of sensitization.

TYPES OF ALLERGIC REACTIONS TO LOCAL ANESTHETICS. Two distinct types of allergic reactions to LAs have been described: Allergic contact dermatitis and delayed swelling at the site of administration - These types of reactions are uncommon but well-established. They begin hours after injection and usually peak within 72 hours.

The most common allergic reactions to cephalosporins are maculopapular rashes and drug fever; urticaria is less common and anaphylaxis is rare [28]. As mentioned earlier, positive skin tests to penicillin are associated with a higher likelihood of allergic reactions to first-generation cephalosporins (about 2%) [29].
