Chlamydia is a phylum of intracellular parasites. These pathogens can cause pneumonia or urinary tract infection and may be involved in coronary heart disease. While both are capable of causing infectious disease, bacteria and viruses are very different. Bacteria are prokaryotic cells that cause disease by producing toxins.

Conversely, a number of diseases that impact humans are caused by bacteria. Bacteria that cause disease are called pathogenic bacteria, and they do so by producing poisonous substances called endotoxins and exotoxins.
